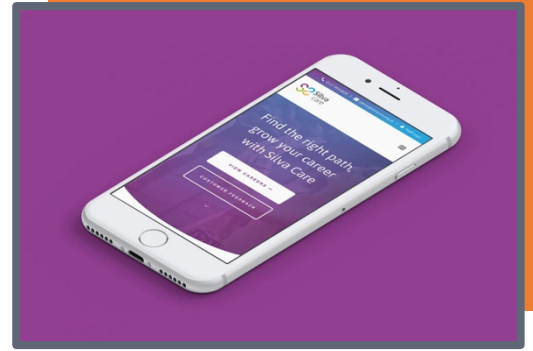




Case Study: Silva Care Website
